

Sedona City Council Approves Water Storage Tank Project That Will Improve Drinking Water Reliability and Enhance Fire Protection

The Sedona City Council voted unanimously on Wednesday, January 23, 2019 to approve the construction of a water storage tank and booster pumping facility proposed by Arizona Water on property located adjacent to State Route 179 and West Mallard Drive in east Sedona. The vote comes after two years of community meetings and a 4 to 1 vote by the Planning and Zoning Commission approving the project on October 16, 2018.

Arizona Water will construct a 1.5 million gallon water storage tank that is almost entirely underground and virtually invisible to passersby. Atop the tank will sit a small equipment building designed in a style that will blend in with the homes nearby. The proposed building design is the result of local community feedback and input by the City of Sedona staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Arizona Water will now begin detailed design of the project, taking into account various conditions placed on the project by the Planning and Zoning Commission. The design and City of Sedona permitting process is expected to complete in the 4th quarter of 2019.

Arizona Water will continue to keep the community notified about various milestones of the project as they approach, including the start of construction and the various aspects of construction that may affect the local community.
