<u>PUBLIC NOTICE OF HEARING ON ARIZONA WATER COMPANY'S RATE APPLICATION</u> (DOCKET NO. W-01445A-24-0117)

Summary

On June 21, 2024, Arizona Water Company ("Arizona Water") filed an application ("Rate Application") for increases to its rates and charges for utility service furnished by its Northern Group, and for certain related approvals. Arizona Water's Northern Group includes the following public water systems: Forrest Towne, Lakeside, Overgaard, Pinetop Lakes, Sedona, Pinewood, Rimrock, and Valley Vista.

Arizona Water asserts that for the test year ending December 31, 2023, its Northern Group had adjusted operating income of \$1.6 million and an original cost rate base ("OCRB") of \$74.7 million, resulting in a rate of return of 2.18 percent on its OCRB. Arizona Water proposes rates and charges that would produce a revenue increase of approximately \$7.46 million, or 48 percent, compared to current base rates. Arizona Water's proposed revenue increase would produce a 4.54 percent rate of return on its proposed fair value rate base ("FVRB") of 157.9 million.

In addition, Arizona Water requests Commission approval of the following:

- Conversion of its existing Arsenic Cost Recovery Mechanism into a Federal Compliance Cost Recovery Mechanism to recover the costs of complying with all federal mandates, including mandates for "forever chemicals" (PFOA and PFAS) and arsenic;
- Adoption of a Sustainable Water Adjustor Mechanism to recover the costs of acquiring new sustainable water supplies;
- Adoption of a Wildfire Protection and Public Safety surcharge mechanism to recover the cost of modernizing aging infrastructure to increase fire flow at the request of customers and firefighting authorities; and
- Adoption of a Tax Expense Adjustment Mechanism to recover changes in income tax rates in between rate cases.

Arizona Water's proposed rates and charges would result in the following revenue increase levels for each customer class:

Arizona Water's proposed rates and charges, not including any approved surcharge or adjustor, would result in the following monthly bill increase for a typical residential water customer served by a 5/8" meter with an average monthly usage of 4,250 gallons:

About Intervention

The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances, interested persons may intervene. An interested person may be granted intervention if the outcome of the case will directly and substantially impact the person, and the person's intervention will not unduly broaden the issues in the case. Intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at hearing and to cross-examine other parties' witnesses. Intervention is not required for you to appear at the hearing and provide public comment, to file written comments in the docket for the case, or to receive emailed notice of each filing made in the case by following the docket.

Information about what intervention means, including an explanation of the rights and responsibilities of an intervenor, is available on the Commission's website (www.azcc.gov) by clicking on "Cases and Open Meetings" and then clicking on "Intervene in a Case." The information includes a Sample Intervention Request and a Fillable Intervention Request Form.

To request intervention, you must file a written request to intervene, either (a) by filing a hard copy request (meeting filing requirements) with Docket Control (Docket Control, 1200 West Washington, Phoenix, AZ 85007), or (b) by **eFiling** the request. Your request **must be filed or eFiled no later than October 1, 2024**. Instructions and restrictions for eFiling are available on the Commission's website at http://azcc.gov/hearing/efile-for-utilities-instruction. You also **must** serve a copy of the request to intervene on each party of record, on the same day that you file the request to intervene with the Commission.

Your request to intervene **must** contain the information below:

- 1. Your name, address, and telephone number;
- 2. The docket number for the case in which you are requesting to intervene;
- 3. A short statement explaining:
 - a. Your interest in the proceeding (e.g., a customer of the regulated company involved, a property owner in an area to be affected by the case, etc.),
 - b. How you will be directly and substantially affected by the outcome of the case, and
 - c. Why your intervention will not unduly broaden the issues in the case;
- 4. A statement certifying that you have sent a copy of your request to intervene to the regulated company or its attorney and to all other parties of record in the case; and
- 5. If you are not represented by an attorney who is an active member of the Arizona State Bar, and you are not representing yourself as an individual, sufficient information and any appropriate documentation to demonstrate

compliance with Arizona Supreme Court Rules 31.1, 31.2, 31.3, 38, 39, and 42, as applicable. This only applies if you are NOT representing yourself and you are not a licensed attorney.

The granting of motions to intervene shall be governed by A.A.C. R14-3-105, except that <u>all motions to intervene</u> must be filed on or before **October 1, 2024**.
